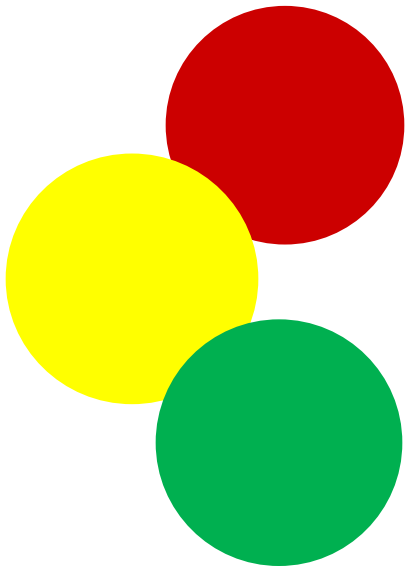

Hearing Health Awareness Program

IF YOUR SCREENING INDICATES:

Sensorineural hearing change

This is usually permanent. It should be evaluated by a hearing health professional and, when indicated, be treated appropriately.

Mixed hearing change

This may be permanent, but depending on the cause may be medically stabilized or improved. Depending on the degree of change, it should be evaluated by a hearing health professional and, when indicated, treated appropriately.

Conductive hearing change

This may be treatable and even reversible. This type of change is often temporary. The most common causes are wax or fluid.

- Consider whether you are experiencing other symptoms – Difficulties hearing well? Fullness, pain, and/or tingling in the ear? Discharge, balance problems?
- Ask yourself whether you or those who know you have noticed any change in your hearing.
- **Take the report generated by this kiosk, inform your doctor about it and ask to be referred for a full hearing assessment.**
